ROAD CLOSED, LIBRARY OPEN

The Town of Lusk continues with the utility and street improvement project and 5th Street, east of Main St., will be under construction this summer and will likely impact the main (south) entrance of the library. INDIAN WARS OF NORTHWEST NEBRASKA PRESENTATION AND BUS TOUR

The library will host historian Randy Kane on **Wednesday, May 24** at 6 p.m. Kane will speak about events that occurred in Dawes and Sioux counties in



Nebraska involving some of the major figures in the Sioux and Cheyenne Indian wars, including Crazy Horse, Red Cloud, Dull Knife, and Buffalo Bill Cody. He will describe the happenings in the 1870s

at such locations as Camp Robinson (later Fort Robinson), Red Cloud Agency, Crow Butte, Warbonnet Creek, and the Council Tree. These events include the Cheyenne Breakout, the killing of Crazy Horse, the "First Scalp for Custer," and the treaty of the Allison Commission. A bus tour of these historical sites will be on **Saturday, June 17**, leaving at 8 a.m. Register by calling Leslie Stewart at 308-430-2464 by 6/10/23. The tour is \$20 with lunch on your own at Ft. Robinson.

Randy spent 37 years as a history interpreter with the National Park Service, mostly at historic sites in the American West. He has worked summers and volunteered at Fort Robinson since 2010. He presently volunteers at the Museum of the Fur Trade in Chadron, Nebraska. His article *Who Killed Crazy Horse?: Politics at Red Cloud Agency, Summer 1877* appeared in the Fall 2020 issue of Nebraska History magazine.

BLOOD PRESSURE KITS AVAILABLE

Self-measured blood pressure monitoring kits are now available for checkout at the Niobrara County Library, thanks to a partnership with the University of Wyoming's Wyoming Center on Aging (WyCOA) and the Wyoming Department of Health's Chronic Disease Prevention Program.

The kits, available in both English and Spanish, include an automated home blood pressure cuff; blood pressure logbooks; educational materials from the American Heart Association; information on what blood pressure is; and ideas for healthy lifestyle changes. The kits also include a resource directory of local community-based organizations and referral resources to the Cent\$ible Nutrition Program and the Healthy U chronic disease self-management program. WYOMING LIBRARY TO BUSINESS AVAILABLE

Wyoming Library to Business is a business-focused, community driven and completely free resource, based in



your local library! This program is part of a national initiative by the American Library Association (ALA) intended to build capacity in libraries offering programming or services to local entrepreneurs and the small business community, prioritizing low-income and underrepresented entrepreneurs.

The goal is to connect Wyoming entrepreneurs and business owners with a curated network of business experts, resources to learn new skills, and the tools to succeed at every stage. Tools available to check out at the library include a laptop with Microsoft Office, webcam, projector, portable foldable photo studio box, flexible tripod kit, microphone stand kit, ring light tripod, collapsible background kit and a complete podcasting station.

SUMMER READING AND PROGRAMS

“Claws, Paws, Feathers & Scales” is the theme for summer reading and children’s programming at the library this year. Traditionally, summer reading programs are designed to encourage children to keep reading during summer vacation. Preventing the “summer slide” continues to be the main objective of library summer reading programs.

The benefits of summer reading programming for children:

- * Children are motivated to read.
- * Children develop positive attitudes about reading, books, and the library.
- * Children maintain their reading skills during summer vacation.
- * Children have access to experiences that further their sense of discovery.
- * Children have access to experiences through which they can learn to work cooperatively.

The library’s “Hey Kids” program begins the end of May for all ages and continues throughout the summer. Stop in the library anytime after May 22 to pick up your books and set your reading goals then check out your library books and start reading! The tracking week ends each Friday beginning June 2 and continues through August 11. When a goal is met for two weeks, a certificate for swimming, ice cream or a treat will be awarded. In mid-August, children who have completed their reading goals throughout the summer will be eligible for additional prizes. The “Hey Kids” program is extended to young adult and adult participants as well!

LegoTime will be held each Tuesday at 1 p.m. beginning on May 30 through August 15 for all ages.



Weekly crafting and activity sessions will be held on Wednesdays beginning May 31 at 1 p.m. through August 16.



Afternoon movies will be featured on Thursdays at 1 p.m. beginning June 1 and running through August 17. The library provides the popcorn; please bring your own drink.

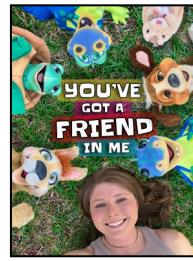


COLORADO PEACHES EXPECTED

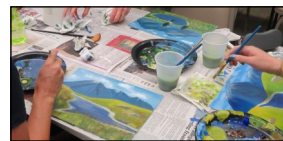
